1.2 Transmission Based Precautions (TBPs)

Standard Infection Control Precautions (SICPs) may be insufficient to prevent cross-transmission of specific infectious agents. Therefore, additional precautions (TBPs) are required to be used by staff. SICPs must still be applied with these additional considerations. Includes guidance on droplet, contact and airborne precautions.

1.3 Built environment and decontamination

The healthcare built environment means the buildings and related infrastructure used for the provision of healthcare. This includes utilities such as water and ventilation and any fixed or semi-permanent components within the healthcare facility with which patients, visitors and staff will interact.
