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## Introduction

The Care Home Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) Resource Toolkit (known herein as ‘the toolkit’) has been produced by the Care Home IPC (CH IPC) team in ARHAI Scotland. The toolkit is a collection of care home related IPC guidance, resources and tools which can support local IPC adoption and implementation. The toolkit should be used in conjunction with the [Care Home Infection Prevention and Control Manual \(CH IPCM\)](#) and supporting resources. It is the Scottish Government expectation that the CH IPCM is adopted and implemented in all care homes in Scotland.

The toolkit contains a collection of key IPC related guidance, resources, and tools from ARHAI Scotland, NHS Education for Scotland (NES), Scottish Antimicrobial Prescribing Group (SAPG) and other national and international organisations, with a focus on those most relevant to care home settings. It has been structured specifically to support care home staff easily identify key IPC materials. The content is not exhaustive and ARHAI Scotland are not responsible for any published tools and resources by external organisations within the toolkit.

### 1.0 Overview

The toolkit presents a variety of care home IPC resources and tools available nationally and internationally in a tabular form. The content is listed within the following categories:

- guidance materials
- communication and display
- implementation
- measurement
- training and education
- strategies

A short description of each resource and tools is included to assist individuals with decision making regarding suitability. The toolkit content will be reviewed regularly, and online access is advised to ensure the most up-to-date information is accessed at care home level.

## **2.0 Who is the toolkit for?**

This toolkit is applicable for use in care homes in Scotland and can be used by care home staff, visitors, volunteers, and others responsible for IPC. Some resources and tools may be deemed more relevant for managers within care homes but overall, the materials have been selected to support the implementation and adoption of IPC practice to support safe care delivery.
